DID YOU KNOW?

If you are interested in attending a postsecondary institution in the USA, you need to write a SAT or ACT admissions test. You need to register for test dates well in advance so check with the Guidance office for test registration information and look for the SAT registration dates on the guidance bulletin board.


You should register now for a test date if you intend to apply for September 2020!

APPLYING OUT OF PROVINCE?

- YOU will need to contact each institution individually to obtain application information. There are some exceptions such as UBC, McGill and Dalhousie which are connected to the OUAC.
- You will also need to ensure that YOU forward or <u>request</u> that we forward all required documentation by the appropriate deadlines (ex. transcripts)
- We're here to help but there is no centralized application process, so you will need to be in charge of your application.
- Remember, letters of reference take time, so contact teachers early!

Taking Private Online Courses (ILC, Virtual High, etc.)?

It is your responsibility to get your gr. 12 report card to Guidance so your marks are uploaded in time



ADMISSION CRITERIA

COLLEGE

- Colleges will look at your grade 11 & 12 marks which include your Gr. 12 semester 1 mid-term marks.
- Some colleges will use an average of your top 6 senior division marks and others will use your Gr. 12 English mark along with other prerequisite course marks.
- Often additional criteria are used such as interviews, assessment tests & portfolios

UNIVERSITY

- Completion of 6 Gr. 12 U or M level courses including ENG4U1 & other criteria such as portfolios & auditions
- Prerequisite courses are usually included in admission averages
- Gr.11 marks are used for early offers of admission

SCHOLARSHIPS

Did you know there are financial awards which are NOT mark based? There are many awards which are based on your involvement in school and in the community.

There are also websites you can visit for scholarship information (see **Helpful Websites** section). Speak to your parents for more information about possible company scholarships at their workplace.

Bursary – awards given for financial need

OSAP – government assistance for student loans. CCI will have an OSAP presentation (April or May)

Entrance Scholarships – money awarded by post-secondary institutions

Offers of Admission

ALL OFFERS ARE CONDITIONAL

<u>COLLEGE:</u> most conditional offers will begin to be sent by mid to late February and will continue through to early June. Some offers will be sent as early as December.

UNIVERSITY: most Ontario universities start sending their early conditional offers in February and then continue throughout the spring. Some conditional offers may be received as early as December.

TIP: apply early because universities & colleges start to process applications as soon as they are received

TIP: You should always have your **student reference number** available when speaking to post-secondary representatives regarding your application.
