- Grade 12 student, Leah Denbok, has upcoming display at Collingwood Public Library showcasing her photographic exhibit of homeless people and their stories. She would like to support Home Horizon, a local charity that helps homeless women, children and youth. Possible partnering with Youth and Action in support of this charity.
- April 10, 2018: OSSLT (Grade 10 Literacy Test) - successful completion is a requirement for high school graduation. Last year's test results to be released to the public tomorrow.
- Sept. 28 – Terry Fox Run – funds are collected, but primary focus is awareness
